Dear Dr. Callahan:


I am pleased to advise you that based on a review of the documents and materials submitted I have found the parties eligible to continue to participate in a collective bargaining agreement under Labor Code Section 3201.5. This letter is not a determination that the collective bargaining agreement itself, or any part of it is in compliance with Section 3201.5. This letter will permit you to continue to maintain an alternative dispute resolution system governing disputes between employees and employers concerning workers' compensation and to continue to maintain an exclusive list of providers of medical treatment, medical evaluation and vocational rehabilitation.

Although the letter of eligibility will expire as to the group on July 31, 2020, it may become ineffective as to an individual employer on an earlier date, if that individual employer no longer carries the required insurance, or is no longer a signatory to a current 3201.5 provision, or otherwise fails to meet the eligibility requirements of Section 3201.5.

Please submit a letter annually outlining any changes as provided by California Code of Regulations §10204(a), in addition to the data required by Labor Code section 3201.5(i).

It is my hope that this alternative workers' compensation system will continue to be beneficial to every party and to the people of California. I hope it will provide high-quality medical care, full compensation to injured workers with minimum dispute, and substantial savings to be redirected to more productive uses.
